

## **Pilot Biography** **For One Hour Flight & Habitat Site Tour in an RV-6 Plane**



Don Miller is the owner and builder of the RV-6 plane offered for the 1 hour tour, and he will be the pilot as well.

Don started flying in 1969, and earned his pilot's license that same year. He is rated in single engine land airplanes and in gliders, and has logged about 950 total flight hours. Don is an engineer by trade, and has built two airplanes (including the RV-6 that will be used for this flight), as well as restoring another plane.

Don and his wife Martha have flown cross-country trips in the RV-6 plane to Colorado Springs, CO and Seattle, WA. In addition to being an engineer (retired from Hewlett Packard after 30+ years) and a pilot, Don is currently the President of the Camarillo Chapter of the Experimental Aircraft Association. He is also on the Board of Directors of Habitat for Humanity of Ventura County, and a Wednesday Crew volunteer with Habitat (currently working on plumbing).

Don has over 10 years of experience flying in Ventura County airspace, and his number of landings has always equaled the number of take offs. ☺

The flight that Don is offering for auction will be one hour in length, will take off from and return to Camarillo Airport, and will include an aerial tour of various Habitat sites, as well as other sites and locations as agreed by Don and the winning bidder. There are some restrictions on the one passenger for this flight, as follows: The passenger must be in good physical health, no taller than 6' 3", must not weigh more than 225 lbs, and must be limber enough to step up on the wing walk and step over the side into the cockpit. Height and weight restrictions are based on the small size of the cockpit, the small size of the plane itself, and center of gravity issues. The RV-6 is a two seater plane. The passenger will also be required to sign a waiver prior to boarding the flight, as well as to present the original flight certificate from the auction.
